The Good, the Bad and the Fun of organizing events

Every one of us has organized an event at least once in our life – from a birthday, graduation party, a wedding or retirement party. What’s the difference between putting on, let’s call them ‘family-&-friend’ events and professional events? Not much. The preparation, excitement and stresses are quite similar and ultimately so is your goal: to make the event a success by ensuring your attendees have fun!

Here are a few tips I’ve learned while organizing the Toastmasters Networking Event series that can help you create a fun event:

- First and foremost, have fun yourself and be ready to face all the challenges and roadblocks that inevitably will happen while setting up and executing the event. If you can do this with a smile and sense of humor, the rest is down-hill.
- Choose the right team of people who are not only fully invested in the outcome but know how to enjoy the journey. I was lucky to have Joyce Feustel, Joan Janis, Michelle Mras, Tom Hobbs & Rebecca Barth who are all not only remarkable speakers, great professionals and insightful coaches - but most importantly - they don’t take themselves too seriously and bring their *joie de vivre* wherever they go and to whatever they do.
- Find the right balance between structure and disorder. Have a clear plan, but also be ready to improvise and embrace opportunities as they arise.
- Give people something unexpected. Surprise goes a long way if you want your event to be remembered. I’m not suggesting you release a dozen squawking chickens among your guests just before the keynote, but something new and creative with a bit more subtlety will do the trick.
