Since 2013 Grand Junction Toastmaster Clubs mentors Youth Leaders (for teens 13-17) Program (YLP) challenges students to sharpen public speaking skills. This annual YLP was taught by alumni students – Megan Rubalcaba and Palmer Meyers – both have attended the program for years. Megan & Palmer stepped up and took over the 6-week program, they developed valuable leadership skills. Twenty-five students were required to present five minute speeches and weekly evaluations. In addition to making impromptu speeches – their favorite, Table Topics.

The program is supported by the Mesa County Libraries (Teen Program) which supplies snacks and copied materials. This was the first year 95+% of youth completed the entire program. All youth participants were winners, it took a great deal of courage for them to stand up and deliver a five minute speech and be critiqued. Each week the Youth voted on which person they felt was best speaker and best evaluator for an award and weekly bragging rights. All students who completed all 6 weeks program were gifted monetary awards from our local Youth Sponsor *Visiting Angels* who have been tremendously generous to the youth program for years. We are preparing for our 2017 Fall YLP which starts October 10, 2017 from 5:30-7:30pm (MDT) at Mesa County Libraries.
