We are encouraging everyone to first make sure you have a login in profile through the main website and review the information provided about Pathways.



The lesson I learned as a Test Speaker that will change everything By: Gretchen Vaughn

In November, I crossed an item off of my Toastmasters bucket list: Being a Test Speaker for the District 26 Evaluation Contest. Thank goodness one of my primary duties was to give an imperfect speech.

I have two consistent problems in my speaking: Long introductions; and a lack of a thread in my manual speeches. Although all the clubs I have belonged to have amazing evaluators, in this one case, they had only identified the symptom and not the underlying problem.



At the district contest, my opening was a story of how when it comes to movie ratings, I am my mother's "adult guardian." I didn't know if I should take her to see *The King's Speech*, which was rated 'R'. That introduction was over three minutes!

The problem? I love storytelling. When I connect with an audience, I don't ever want to let go. It has gotten worse this year as I became addicted to telling true, personal, five-minute stories at The Moth StorySlam. But, a five-minute introduction to a "Research Your Topic" speech is far too long.

In hearing seven different variations of a common suggestion, I finally heard the solution: Don't tell the entire story in the beginning; tell parts of it with each point, building throughout the speech.

EUREKA! Now I'll state my point clearly and up front, without having to let go of my story and the fun I'm having with the audience. Thank you to all the evaluation contestants! Together you have given me a lifelong gift.
