Colorado Springs resident is regional finalist in the world's largest speech contest Gregory Williams rises above a pool of nearly 200 contestants

Denver, Colo., May 15, 2019 — Gregory Williams of Colorado Springs, Colorado, outshined nearly 200 contestants to win the district-level competition of the Toastmasters International Speech Contest. Williams advances to the regional round of the contest, vying for one of the semifinal spots in the World Championship of Public Speaking® to be held at the Toastmasters International Convention on Saturday, August 24, in Denver, Colorado.

Williams, a member of Pikes Peak Toastmasters Club, https://3044.toastmastersclubs.org/, in Colorado Springs, Colorado, surpassed fierce competition to win over the judges with his speech, "Yes You Can!" The speech touched on the themes of overcoming adversity, bravery, passion and confidence, as well as a determination to succeed no matter the odds.

Williams will compete with other winners from districts around the world who advanced to the 2019 regional round after a six-month process of elimination through club, area, division and district speech competitions. Their 5- to 7-minute speeches were judged on content, organization, format and style.

The Toastmasters International Speech Contest began in 1938 and is the world's largest speech contest, involving 30,000 participants from 141 countries. It culminates with the popular World Championship of Public Speaking held annually at the organization's International Convention.
